
many new friends and many great memories from each NSD Coronation and events throughout my reign, "Thank You" to each NSD Queen and their escorts for your warm welcome!

Introducing Queen-elect Debbie Renfro. Two weeks after my birth in Missoula Montana, my parents and I moved to Oakland California and this began my life as a Navy "brat", wife, and mother. For the first thirteen years of my life, I moved eleven times, crisscrossing the country.

Our last cross country trip

was from Pensacola Florida to Oak Harbor Washington. My brother, sister and I were squeezed together in the back seat of our car and I sat in the middle to keep my younger siblings from fighting. My dad hung an ugly green, rubber Tiki monster from the rear view mirror and every time we got out of hand, he would give that monster a whack and say "shut up green thing!" The shouts would turn to giggles and for a short time the stress and boredom of the trip was eased.

I moved to Oak Harbor Washington when I was in the eighth grade and settled for the first time in my life. It was the longest I had ever lived somewhere and I think of Oak Harbor as my hometown. It is where I went to high school, college,

got married for the first time and where my first daughter Heather was born.

After Oak Harbor, I moved three more times first to Manteca California, where my youngest daughter Melody was born. Next we moved to Japan. We were lucky enough to have made friends with some of the "locals" and were invited to participate in their festivals. They are similar to block parties only with traditional festival clothes and shrines - usually two - a small one that a group of boys would carry and a much larger one the men would carry that was so big a 10 year old boy could stand on it. His job was to clap and chant to keep tempo for the men. While we were stationed in Japan we were able to visit Thailand, the Philippines, and South Korea. During this tour my parents were stationed in Sicily and that meant my family was living on three different continents! When our tour of duty in Japan ended, we moved to Lemoore and I have been here ever since. My daughters grew up here and I think of Lemoore as home.

I am a federal employee at NAS Lemoore, Aviation Support Department and I am the Stock Control Officer. My branch procures replacement parts for the F-18 Hornet. This job has afforded me the ability to be a single mother, challenged me to learn and grow in business philosophies, and introduced me to my beloved husband, Jim.

My father retired from the Navy after 41 years, my brother enlisted in the Army for 4 years (my father hated that!) and my first husband served 20 years. Jim was in the Navy for 4 years and then was a civil service employee for 41 years and I have been in civil service for 24 years - a combined total of 134 years of military and federal service that my family has given to our great country. The Navy has been such a huge part of my life, of my families' life, and what I consider to be a part of my legacy.

Jim and I started taking dance lessons when Melody became engaged so we could dance at her wedding. Jim was skeptical but willing to try and was the start of our partnership and many lessons later we became members in the VSD. It is with honor that I will represent Visalia as Queen following the May 17th coronation.

The social dance which was held in April had a welcome to Spring theme. The hall was decorated as one would expect for Spring, with lovely plants, and with the surprise bowls of spring colored jelly beans at each table. Actually, licorice may not be a Spring color, but I didn't care. I seemed to be one of the few with a lust for licorice, so I took advantage of it. 

George Schmidt is dancing with the angels! He left the love of his life, Norma Schmidt, on March 16, 2014. For all those who knew him, George was a blessing to Fresno Smooth Dancers.

December 13, 1932-March 16, 2014

George was born and raised in southwest Fresno. His father and mother, German Russian immigrants, helped found and build the German Church of God located on F and Los Angeles Streets where services were conducted in German. The younger members transitioned to The First Church of God located on First and Saginaw. George served on the board of trustees and was the president of the board. He was also the church choir director.

George began his banking career at Cocker Bank and worked there for 22 years. He was also President of Madera Valley Bank and Vice President of Bank of Fresno.

NSD PRESIDENTS' GAVEL CLUB AWARD

By Vern Miranda

All Chapter Members' of NSD are encouraged to consider nominating a chapter member for the Presidents' Gavel Club Award for this ensuing year. The following rules are provided for your formation:

- 1. Membership Membership in the Gavel Club is made up of all past and current presidents of any chapter of the Smooth Dancers, Inc.
- 2. Assessment Membership in the Gavel Club is non-assessable. Voluntary donations are requested when necessary.
- 3. Purpose The purpose of the Gavel Club, beyond the social aspects, is to, when appropriate, select a nominee and qualified member of The National Smooth Dancers, Inc. to receive the Presidents' Gavel Club Award.
- 4. Nominations Nominations for this award must be in writing and submitted to the Chairperson of the Gavel Club by August 1st of the year that the nomination will be presented for consideration.
- 5. Nomination Letter The letter of nomination must contain a description of the qualifications that the nominee possesses, and must reflect the criteria stated in the rule 6.
- 6. Candidate Qualifications The candidate for the Presidents' Gavel Award must be a member in good standing and have performed OUTSTANDING service to the organization.
- 7. Candidate Member Nominations must be for an individual member of the organization. Nominations for two or more candidates will not be accepted.
- 8. Nomination Period A nomination period may be carried for two years only. If the nominee is not selected within the two-year period the nomination will lapse.
- 9. Voting Privileges Only Gavel Club members, present at the time of voting, will be allowed to vote.
- 10. Balloting Balloting will be conducted by secret ballot at the Gavel Club Award Brunch. ONLY Gavel Club Members can attend the Brunch (except as specified in Rule 13). Gavel Club members may attend the business session of the brunch without attending the brunch itself. All members present at the balloting will receive a packet, which will include the nominating letters for all candidates and a list of all past winners.
- 11. Vote Count Three members assigned to this function by the Gavel Club Chairperson will count the votes. Only the Chairperson and the ballot counters will be made aware of the winner of the award. They MUST NOT reveal the winner to any other person. The Gavel Club Award Chairperson at the Awards Breakfast will announce the winner.
- 12. Declaring A Winner To win on the first ballot a candidate must receive 50 percent plus one vote. If a second

ballot is required, the two candidates with the highest number of votes will be placed on the second ballot. A simple majority will declare a winner.



13. Non-voting participants - Gavel Club Award winners, who are not members of the Gavel Club, are welcome to attend the Gavel Club Bunch and Meeting as non-voting participants.
