Building, which we are constantly improving. What is more important, we have a professional teacher who gears our lessons to our needs and requests. He prepares us to get the most from our family events, weekly and monthly dances, and especially for our annual Board of Directors Meeting.

Someone we can count on for expert Ballroom dance lessons and guided instruction is Dan Goss. Dan was born on October 27, 1954, in Butler, Pennsylvania. In the early 70s, while attending Purdue University, a friend invited him to a party at the Midwest Dance Club. He signed up for their Guest program, and then bought a ten lesson package. At Studio 65 in Fresno where he teaches Ballroom, Swing, and Latin styles, Dan is also the owner/operator/teacher. His students range from 18 to 100 and from social dancers to competition level. Some of his students have competed and won awards in the **US Pro Am, the Holiday Dance Classic, the Emerald Ball Dance, the Sapphire Ball DanceSport, the California Open DanceSport Championships, and the USA Grand National Dances.**

As you can see, Dan is very supportive of the Dance Arts in our central valley. He is the Grange Master of the West Visalia Grange where he also holds classes. He has choreographed, escorted and danced with several Queen-elects in the NSD Coronations in Visalia, Fresno, and Bakersfield.

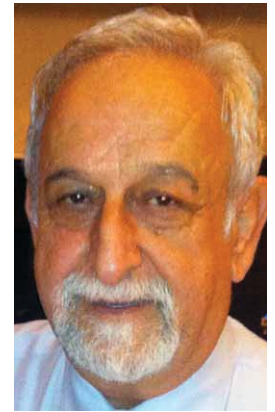


**VALENTINA
