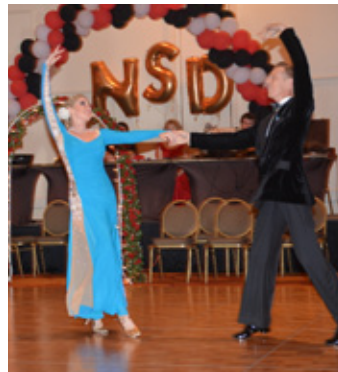

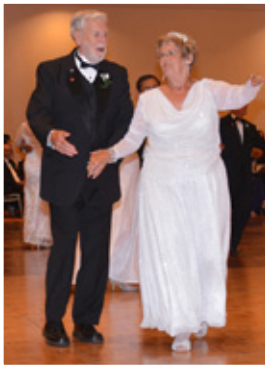
Queen's Reflections

Thanks to my wife Susan who kept me from going completely nuts and is now the State Queen so we hope to see most of you throughout the year ahead.

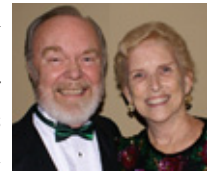

The weekend after the Convention, we all got together and had a potluck barbecue at Tom and Sandy's house and discussed everything again and just had a good time. On September

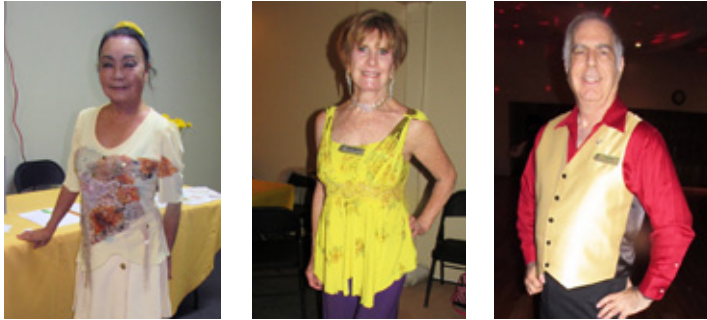
17th Victor and Debby and Chuck and Susan took a one week “recovery” cruise. We flew to Vancouver and sailed down to LA—so nice not having to fly home.

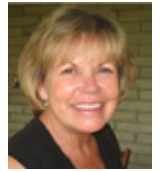

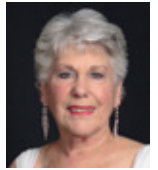

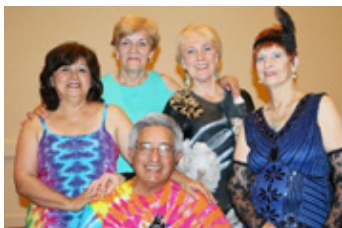

Entertainment at our "Message in a Bottle" dance was provided by Bart and Nancy Ramentas.

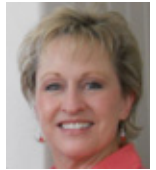
They performed a vibrant Tango and playful Cha-Cha. Thank you Nancy and Bart for your performance.
