Third Time is Charming for Been Kao

Kao's first coronation happened so long ago (2007, I believe) that I only vaguely remember anything beyond her sparkly white gown and her Queen's waltz to the strains of "Starlight." But most of her second coronation remains crystal clear to me: from nearly a decade ago,

in March 2013, the "Lady in Red" remains locked away in my memory as deeply as it remains etched in the history of National Smooth Dancers.



Kao's favorite color is red and instead of white she wanted to wear her bright red ball gown for her second trip to the coronation arch. That, of course, was verboten in those days: all NSD Queens wore white for every coronation, including their own. But Kao really wanted that red gown for her special day this time. (I don't know when or how the tradition of wearing white became an entrenched part of NSD coronation tradition; long ago, as I read somewhere, NSD Queens wore pastel colors when they were part of a Coronation Court.)

So, bravely—not knowing what kind of reception her break from tradition would receive outside her own enthusiastic chapter—Kao made plans for her "Lady in Red" evening. As the visiting Queens assembled in the second-floor lobby of the old Champion Ballroom in Hillcrest, Kao joined them dressed in her sparkly white gown. Mingling with the others, she made the usual last-minute adjustments to her hair and her accessories. Then she fell in at the end of the line as the Queens began to enter the ballroom one by one for their procession to the white arch at the end of the ballroom.

As soon as the first Queen began walking with her escort, though, Kao slipped back into Mary Murphy's office

overlooking Fifth Avenue. Since this office sported a floor-toceiling picture window, she crawled under the office desk to change discreetly out of her white gown and into the red one.

Meanwhile, I stood near the entrance to the ballroom splitting my attention between the door of Mary's office and the action at the coronation arch, wondering when my lovely Queen was going to reappear so I could escort her to that arch without delaying the ceremony. Just in time there she was, glowing in her red gown and ready to make her break-withtradition glide across the ballroom floor.

I swear I can still hear—or did I really only sense it at the time?—the sudden soft intake of a hundred or so surprised breaths across the ballroom as we entered the hall and slowly made our winding way to the arch. Kao floated in a shimmering crimson haze as she circled around me, catching her guests' eyes, sending her bright smile to every corner of the room and beaming with the knowledge that she was doing something really special that evening.

Of course, she faced the music later (and it was decidedly not dance music): during the Crown Circle meeting at a subsequent coronation, Kao was excoriated by a few of the long-time Queens who did not want to lose those white dresses. Fortunately, cooler heads did speak up and Kao found support among the majority of her fellow Queens, past and current at the time. And so tradition was modified a bit and Kao found that she had many royal—and loyal—friends who agreed with her position.

Because of Kao's arguably brave gamble, Queens today still wear their color of choice for their own coronations. This new tradition was picked up immediately after Kao's coronation by Queen Gee Gee Barden at hers. As I remember, Gee Gee's gown was a rich teal and her theme was, "We are the Lucky Ones." We're all lucky to be ballroom dancers, and since Kao's "Lady in Red" event I think NSD Queens have also been lucky because they can wear their favorite colors as they are crowned.

Queen Kao doesn't have any surprises planned for her third Coronation. For myself, though, I can't get the image of those early NSD Queens—arrayed in pastels for a softly muted palette of warm colors—out of my mind's eye. Maybe if EVERY visiting Queen were to show up for Kao's third coronation with her must-have white coronation gown AND her favorite pastel dress, we might witness another milestone in NSD history. Who knows. . . ?



At the end of 2021, I, Marci Diller, was fortunate to be able to visit the Los Angeles chapter at the Garabaldina for their Christmas dance. What's really nice about visiting a different chapter is that you realize that dancers are family. I was warmly greeted by the then Queen-elect Sandy Wells and was never left


Then on to 2022, the

Richard Long:



Bea Chow, 1992 GGSD Queen:


